



Sport Premium Funding 2015/2016 after school sports club participation data

From September 2013 the Government has allocated funding direct to primary schools and academies to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Each school will receive £8,000 per annum plus an extra £5 per pupil for each year for the academic year 2015/2016.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

Several of the academies priorities when considering the effective use of the 'Sport Premium funding' include:

- *The removal barriers to pupil participation in sport, such as financial restraints.*
- *Offering pupils the opportunity to engage in high quality after school sports clubs.*
- *Creating a sporting legacy for the Academy and the community to be proud of.*
- *Raising the profile of PE and sport across school as a tool for whole school improvement.*

Detailed below are the attendance figures for the academy's after school sports clubs for each year group for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2.
